

## Shooting

This is the most common form of hunting in France and is practiced by a large majority of huntsmen. Hunting estates can thus be found for sale all over the country.

Shooting requires a rifle or shotgun. It is a highly regulated activity being forbidden, for example, from a vehicle apart from in special cases (e.g. people with disabilities).

There, you can hunt alone, as part of a beat, with pointers or with venery hounds. Since 1995, the sale of shooting estates has also been of interest to bow hunters, as this form of hunting is also classified as a kind of shooting.

**N.B. you will be required to produce the necessary certificates. Special training is available for bow hunting.**

However, shooting estates are also home to big game animals such as the red deer, wild boar or roe deer, especially in Auvergne, Limousine and Franche-ComtÃ©. In Aquitaine and Poitou-Charentes, the wood pigeon draws some specific buyers.



In the northern half of France, especially Ile-de-France, Normandy, Picardy, the North, Centre, Brittany, Champagne-Ardenne, Lorraine and Burgundy, the estates are often much vaster, stretching over several thousand hectares. Hunting with hounds is a very specific kind of hunting and requires such large estates.
